



Roy Rudolph DeCarava (December 9, 1919 – October 27, 2009) was an African American artist. DeCarava received early critical acclaim for his photography, initially engaging and imaging the lives of African Americans and jazz musicians in the communities where he lived and worked. Over a career that spanned nearly six decades, DeCarava came to be known as a founder in the field of black and white fine art photography, advocating for an approach to the medium based on the core value of an individual, subjective creative sensibility, which was separate and distinct from the "social documentary" style of many predecessors. His interest in education led him to found

A Photographer's Gallery (1955–57), which tried to gain public recognition for photography as an art, and a workshop for African American photographers in 1963. He also taught at the Cooper Union School of Art from 1969 to 1972. In 1975 he joined the faculty at Hunter College. He is perhaps best known for his portraits of jazz musicians, which capture the essence of such <u>legends</u> as <u>Louis Armstrong</u>, <u>John Coltrane</u>, <u>Duke Ellington</u>, and <u>Billie Holiday</u> in the midst of performances. These portraits, which he began in 1956, were shown in 1983 in an exhibit at Harlem's Studio Museum. Many of DeCarava's jazz portraits were published in *The Sound I Saw: Improvisation on a Jazz Theme* (2001). In 1996 the Museum of Modern Art organized a DeCarava retrospective that traveled to several cities and introduced his work to a new generation. DeCarava received a National Medal of Arts in 2006.



The novel coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic has forever changed our world, our society, the way we interact, how we spend our free time, and ultimately includes our participation at our South East Queens Camera Club weekly meetings, field trips, social gatherings, and competitions.

This new environment confirmed that as a club, we are much stronger together and that we enjoy the fellowship that the club brings, as well as each other's company, regardless of the circumstances, we continue to enjoy our compatibility while pursuing our love of photography.

On March 17<sup>th</sup>, when the Parks Department closed the Roy Wilkins Recreation Center for the unforeseeable future, it also happened to be the location where we hosted our weekly meetings, and it shut down all of our planned events. Our executive board moved swiftly to examine how we can continue with our agenda of weekly meetings, scheduled events, presenting our programs and educational sessions and move forward with our monthly competitions.

Our resiliency paid off and we began our first ever virtual club meeting aboard the Zoom platform on Tuesday, April 7, 2020. Thus far, we have held two executive board meetings, two competitions, several weekly monthly meetings, which demonstrate that SEQCC is up for the task in this new world order. Efficiency is the name of the game, allowing us to be in communication from home, fully wired on mobile phones, laptops, and other devices.
