



A Passion for Wildlife Photography, the Stories Behind the Images Topic

This talk is based on my more than 35 plus years' experience photographing wildlife and covers the requirements, strategies, techniques, and equipment required to capture engaging images of animals in their natural habitat. Included is information on lighting and composition, plus locating, attracting, and approaching wildlife. The program is interwoven with some entertaining stories behind some of the images.

Biography

For more than 35 years, I have shared my photographic experiences and love of nature with thousands of individuals through more than 300 photo classes, workshops, lectures, and tours in both the U.S. and abroad including Kenya, Iceland, Newfoundland, the Falkland Islands, the Brazilian Pantanal, South Dakota Badlands, Bosque del Apache, Chincoteague NWR, Tangier Island, etc. Program sponsors have included zoos, nature centers, camera clubs, and conservation organizations such as National Wildlife Federation and the Assateague Island Alliance. For many years, I have taught photography classes at Johns Hopkins University and other educational institutions and have written "How To" articles on nature photography for national publications such as *Outdoor Photographer and Birding*. My images have appeared in magazines, calendars, and books published by National Wildlife Federation, Natural History Society, Audubon, and Sierra Club. Credits include the book, "*Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, an Ecological Treasure*".

Presentation by Jean Marie Bain, Concerning Dr. Earnest Withers

On February 14, our very own Jean Bain, presented us with a Black History lesson many of us will never forget. During the summer, Jean and a few of her girlfriends visited Memphis Tennessee, where she came across a bookstore. There, Jean learned about a black photographer, Earnest Withers, who is maybe not as celebrated as he should be.

Earnest Withers, was born in Memphis on Aug. 7, 1922, and died Oct.15, 2007. He took an early interest in photography, taking photos of funerals, commercials, the Memphis nightclub scene, black artists, and black activists. He photographed some

of the up and coming personalities of his and our era, however, he is best known for his iconic work during the Civil Rights movement.

Jean, in her enlightened style, told of an Earnest Withers who took photos of Ray Charles, Ike and Tina Turner, B.B. King, and Aretha Franklin. He would become friends with major Civil Rights figures like Medgar Evers and Martin Luther King Jr. Withers shot many Civil Rights photos that we are all familiar with; the famous "I Am A Man" photo of the Memphis sanitation strikers is one of many. He would be published in Jet, Ebony, Newsweek, Life, and the New York Times.

Knowing the hardships African Americans faced throughout our history in America, one can imagine the harassment, the arrests, the beatings, the betrayals that Withers endured from people who did not want their racism exposed for the world; but, endure he did. Wither's most active period of photography illustrates: have only touched the surface of his prolific life.


Jean purchased a book entitled, "Revolution in Black and White" that tells a more complete story of the life of Earnest Withers. She recommends it to anyone interested in photography during the Civil Rights era and beyond.

We thank Jean for her thorough research and knowledge of Earnest Withers, and for making us aware of his place in American history.

9 Composition Tips For Amazing Photos

- 1. **Framing:** The method of using elements of your scene to create a frame around the main subject of your photo, drawing the viewer's attention and giving the image a more artistic feel.
- 2. **Leading Lines:** Lines that lead the viewer's eye from one part of a composition to another, generally moving toward the main subject.
- 3. **Symmetry:** As in geometry, the exact match in size and shape between two halves, parts or sides.
- *4. Contrast:* The Visual difference in tones, textures, highlights, shadow and color.
- 5. *Patterns:* In photography when elements occur naturally or which you can create with your composition repeat throughout the frame. (Often consist of lines, shapes and color, creating a design for the eye to follow).
- 6. *Filling the Frame:* The technique of composing an image so that positive space takes up most or all of the frame.
- 7. *Use of a Wide Aperture:* Your lens lowest aperture setting is a wide aperture, letting more light in to reach the sensor. (Creates a shallow depth of field).
- 8. Negative Space: The space surrounding your main subject.
- 9. **Shadows:** Often overlooked or even avoided but used creatively, can transform every day images into eye catching art.

Composition Restrictive Theme for April 2023
