Chester Higgins

Renowned Photographer and His Contributions

Born November 1946 in Fairhope, Alabama—an American photographer, known for his significant contributions to photography, particularly in the field of photogournalism. His work has been widely cele

particularly in the field of photojournalism. His work has been widely celebrated for its ability to capture the essence of the African American community and their experiences throughout history.

Higgins began his career in photography in the late 1950s, working for various publications such as Ebony and Jet magazines. His early work focused on documenting the Civil Rights Movement, capturing iconic moments and events that shaped the history of the United States.

In 1963, he joined The New York Times, where he worked for over three decades. His time there allowed him to further hone his skills and expand his range of subjects, capturing everything from everyday life to important political events. One of his most notable achievements during this period was being the first African American staff photographer for The New York Times.

His work has been widely recognized and celebrated. He has received numerous awards and accolades, including the prestigious Guggenheim Fellowship in 1978. His photographs have been exhibited in galleries and museums worldwide, and his work has been published in numerous books and collections.

His contributions to photography extend beyond his captivating images. He has also been a mentor to many aspiring photographers, sharing his knowledge and experience with the


next generation of image-makers. His dedication to the art of photography and his unwavering commitment to documenting the African American experience makes Chester Higgins, an essential figure in the history of photography.
